



Welcome to our venue layout and seating plan tool.

This is designed to help you decide how to lay out your wedding or event.

The scale drawing of the barn shows all of the permanent fixtures such as the bar and doors as well the non permanent fixtures such as the partition that is put up for the Civil Ceremonies.

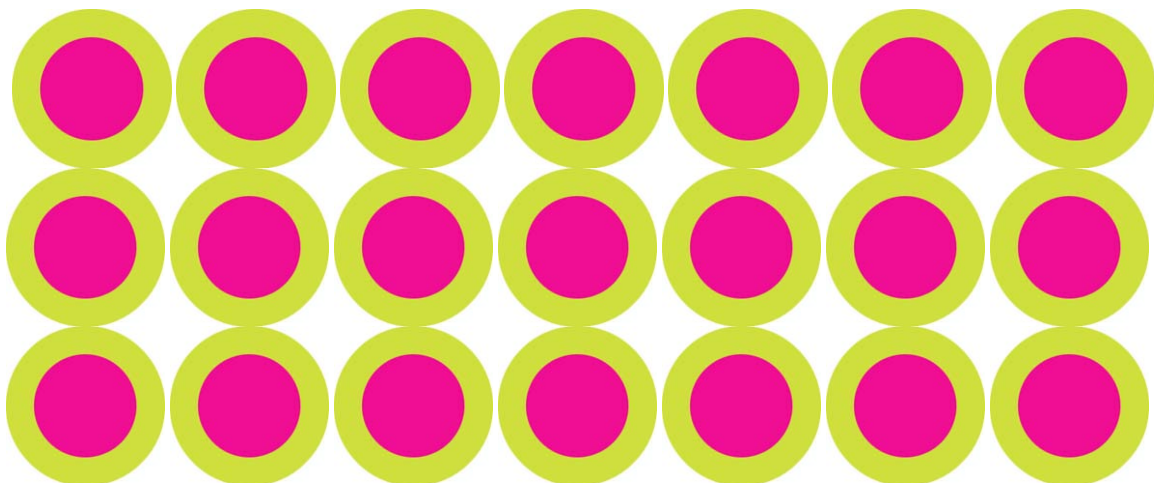
The partition is also used for smaller weddings or events to create a more intimate atmosphere so your guests are not rattling around in a huge space and can be removed when your evening guests arrive. For Larger weddings the partition is removed after the ceremony.

Below you will see what looks like some fried eggs! These are scale drawings of our banqueting tables (in pink) and the space you need to allow for chairs and room for your guests to get in and out of their seats (in green)

Cut out the pink and green table templates and place them on the plan to help decide where to put your tables. The edges of the table templates can touch as shown below.

Each table usually sits between 8 -10 guests although they can sit 12 tightly at a table. There are also scale drawings of the trestle tables used for the top table if you decide to have one – each trestle table sits between 2 and 3 people.
